Joining Saint Anne's Episcopal Church

Welcome to Saint Anne's Episcopal Church. The information that follows pertains to joining the church. Please note that you are welcome to worship at Saint Anne's regardless of whether you have formally joined the church. If you have questions about worship, baptism, marriage, burial, or any other church rites and ministries, please contact our clergy at 302-378-2401.

If you are considering joining Saint Anne's, we are delighted that you have found us. Please read through the information included here. And if you have questions or need more information about church membership, don't hesitate to contact our clergy.

Church Membership

Following the *Constitution and Canons of The Episcopal Church*, Saint Anne's designates church membership as:

All baptized persons who are sixteen years of age and older, who regularly attend the worship of the Parish, and whose names have been entered for at least six months upon the Parish records as making a financial contribution to the Parish shall be members in good standing of the Parish.

Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body, the Church. The Episcopal Church recognizes all baptisms administered with water and in the Triune name: "of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," regardless of the denomination in which the sacrament was performed.

Full initiation means that no other rite, such as Confirmation or First Communion, is required for a person to be a full member of the Body of Christ, the Church, and to receive Holy Communion.

The Episcopal Church offers the rite of Confirmation, in which the baptized receive the laying on of hands by a bishop. For questions about Confirmation, please speak with our clergy.

If you are not baptized, unsure if you are baptized, if your immediate family members are not baptized, or if you have questions about Baptism, please speak with our clergy.

Sixteen years old is the age at which a baptized person is an adult in the Church. Children younger than sixteen who are baptized and whose parents or guardians are church members are considered church members as a part of their families.

Regular participation in worship means attending Sunday worship as often as a person's circumstances and schedule allow, with participation in at least three Sunday worship services in twelve months.

A financial contribution is a monetary donation given to the church within the previous six months.

The Church Canons stipulate that a person must attend worship and have made a financial contribution to the church for at least six months before the person is eligible to serve in church leadership (e.g., Vestry, Sunday school teacher, or youth leader) or liturgical roles (e.g., lector or Eucharistic minister). This six-month period allows the person to become familiar with the church and for the church to get to know the person. Because the church does not record who attends Sunday worship but does record all financial contributions, the six-month period begins on the first date that a financial contribution is recorded. Persons who satisfy these conditions for Church Membership are considered Active Church Members and may participate fully in the worship, mission, and ministry of the Church.

Transferring Your Church Membership

If you are a member of another church, you may transfer your membership to Saint Anne's by contacting your church and requesting a Letter of Transfer. Have the Letter mailed to Saint Anne's Episcopal Church, 15 E. Green St., Middletown, DE 19709. Once our Church Office receives your Letter of Transfer, we will send you a letter confirming that your membership has been transferred to Saint Anne's.

Other Opportunities for Church Members

Annual Pledge: Saint Anne's invites Church Members—as individuals and as families—to make a financial Pledge to support the church in a calendar year. A financial Pledge is a promise and a sign of our commitment as Church Members. To make their Pledge, Church Members discern what their financial contribution to the church will be for the next calendar year (or if the Pledge is submitted during the year, what their financial contribution will be for the remainder of the year), and then they return their Pledge to the Church Office. All Pledge amounts are welcome and kept confidential. Although making a Pledge is not required for Church Membership, it is greatly encouraged and appreciated, as it allows the church leadership to know what Church Members plan to give to support the church's worship, mission, and ministry.

Reception into The Episcopal Church and Renewal of Baptismal Vows are two rites available to Church Members when the Bishop of The Episcopal Church in Delaware visits Saint Anne's. Reception is a rite for persons who were baptized and confirmed in another denomination and want to be formally received into The Episcopal Church. Renewal of Baptismal Vows is a rite for baptized people who have been absent from the church for many years and now desire to reaffirm their baptism. Neither of these rites is required for Church Membership. For more information about these rites, please speak with our clergy.
